EDUCATION SERVICE DISTRICT (ESD)

The ESD provides many different services aimed toward improving the educational opportunities of children from kindergarten through 12th grade and also some programs for preschoolers. Services include speech and language therapy, behavior specialists, and preschool for special needs students (EI and ECSE as described below) and the Complex Needs Classroom. Services for school age children are provided following a referral by school districts.

Early Intervention (EI) and Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) Programs:

EI & ECSE provides supportive, educational, and therapy services and opportunities to young children (Birth to Five) with disabilities or special education needs. Our services are designed to assist with and encourage development and to promote as much independent functioning as possible. Family consultation is provided for families. Services are offered in the home setting or natural environment for children from birth to three years of age. Children who are three to five years old are offered special education in a variety of preschool settings.

Low Incidence Consulting Team: The low incidence Consulting Team provides services to school districts to support pre-school and school-age students who qualify for special education or Section 504 eligibility under Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), Orthopedic Impairment (OI) or Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI). Support services are also available for students who qualify under Other Health Impairment (OHI), and who also have a significant motor impairment that adversely affects their ability to benefit from their educational program. 541-440-4764

Complex Needs Classroom: The Complex Needs Classroom, at Fir Grove Elementary School, in Roseburg, serves Douglas County students who have chronic and/or fluctuating health status which requires frequent monitoring and judgments about their care, and who need a high level of experience and judgment on the part of classroom staff. For placement in the classroom, students must qualify for special education under Other Health Impairment (OHI), Orthopedic Impairment (OI), or Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) eligibility and may have additional eligibilities, with a need for multiple, intensive related services. IEP goals typically emphasize functional skills rather than academics.

HEALTHY START

Provides voluntary screening and personalized referral services for all first birth families and intensive home visiting services for those facing multiple challenges. Services are designed to meet the needs of individual families by promoting strong, healthy, safe environments through parent education, guidance and support for first-time parents directly in their home. Services are free of charge and available before or at the birth and until the child reaches three years of age.

THE LEARNING CHILD (TLC)

TLC is a *Mercy Foundation* committee of concerned volunteers who believe every child should begin each school year ready to learn. The economic situation in Douglas County has had a devastating impact on the ability of families to provide their children with the necessary and most basic school supplies. Not having pencils, paper, and other required items is not only humiliating for these children, but prevents them from participating fully in the learning experience. Each year the TLC Committee spearheads "The Learning Child: From Head-to-Toe and Back-to-School" fundraising campaign with assistance and support of community members and local agencies. Each autumn, hundreds of disadvantaged children (grades K-8) are sent to school ready to learn, with backpacks, school supplies, and shoes provided by the TLC Committee. **Who Receives the Supplies?** To maintain confidentiality, the Child Welfare Division of the Oregon Department of Human Services and local school counselors identify the recipients and distribute the school-related items and shoes. Each elementary and middle school in Douglas County receives supplies to be distributed as needed.
